**ACTION ITEMS:**

**22-G-133 Consideration of a sponsorship request from Holy Redeemer School's Home and School Association for the Monster Dash 5K and 1K Trick or Trot in the amount of \$2,500.**

Mr. Fields said this application was reviewed by Councilmembers Kabir and Mackie, the two remaining members of the Grants Subcommittee. They recommend approval to Council. The applicant, Paula Tuttle, is on the Zoom meeting. The City Attorney had some concerns about the grant which have been explained to Ms. Tuttle. She agreed to do additional due diligence to satisfy those concerns. Staff request is to consider this in special session tonight due to the timing.

Councilmember Mackie said this was a great event last year and it fulfills two of our OKRs. They submitted a report after last year's event.

Ms. Tuttle said the City sponsored the event last year and agreed it was a great event. They will try to include as many people as they can.

**A motion was made by Councilmember Mackie and seconded by Councilmember Kabir to approve a sponsorship, in the amount of \$2,500, for the Holy Redeemer Home and School Association Monster Dash 5K Race.**
